

A Tutorial in Chalice Preparation

Having discussed Eucharistic vestments in past weeks, it seems appropriate to now discuss the altar and altar linens.

The altar at Saint Andrews has a frontal which covers, from top to bottom, the front and sides of the altar. The color of the frontal reflects the season of the liturgical year. The frontal, thankfully, does not need to be laundered.

The Fair Linen is like a tablecloth. It covers the entire top of the altar and extends down each side. The laundering and ironing of the Fair Linen could take up far more time than allowed in the E-pistle, but suffice it to say that it is complicated!

The smaller altar linens are the corporal, the purificator, the pall (all square in shape) and the lavabo towel (an oblong).

The corporal sits below the chalice and is meant to capture any crumbs that might fall from the consecrated bread. It has a cross embroidered on the center of one edge. How it is folded is, again, a topic for another E-pistle!

The purificator is probably the most familiar of the altar linens. It is smaller than the corporal, and is draped over the chalice at the beginning of the Eucharist It has a cross embroidered in the center. It is used by the chalicist to wipe the rim of the chalice when communicants sip from the common cup. Then the chalicist wipes the rim and discreetly turns the chalice to offers a clean spot to the next communicant.

The pall is a square of still material covered with linen. It has a cross embroidered in the center and is used to cover the chalice at the Eucharist.

The lavabo towel is offered to the priest as a part of the ceremonial cleansing of the celebrant's hands at the offertory of the eucharist. "The term is from the Latin, "I will wash," taken from the opening of Psalm 26:6, "I will wash my hands in innocence, O Lord, that I may go in procession round your altar." This verse was traditionally recited by the celebrant during the lavabo ceremony." (An Episcopal Dictionary of the Church)

The person who trained me to be a member of the Altar Guild said "this is the Lord's table and second best won't do." We care for St. Andrew's altar and its linens with that thought foremost in out minds.




